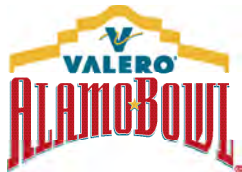

The second year of a four-year bowl cycle kicks in this season and the Pac-12 welcomes a new addition to the lineup. The Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque will feature the Pac-12's seventh selection against an opponent from the Mountain West Conference.

The Pac-12 has agreements with seven bowl partners. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion, unless said champion is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings. If that were the case, the Pac-12 champion would play in the BCS National Championship Game hosted by the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

Regardless of the disposition of the Pac-12 champion, a second Pac-12 team may be selected for an at-large berth in the Bowl Championship Series in any given year and other Pac-12 bowl partner arrangements provide for that occurrence.

In addition to the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Pac-12 bowl partners include the Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, the Bridgepoint Education Holiday Bowl in San Diego, the Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso, the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco, and the Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque.
